The Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) has prepared the enclosed Notice of Intent to Prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for this project. BPA proposes to improve the existing Lyle Falls Fishway in Klickitat County, near Lyle, Washington. The improvements would ease fish passage to upstream high quality habitat in the Klickitat Basin and improve capabilities to trap and handle adult fish. The enclosed Notice of Intent provides additional information regarding this proposed project.

The Notice of Intent also gives information on comment opportunities and a public meeting to help determine the range of actions, alternatives, and impacts to address in the EIS. The public meeting, as well as a field trip to the site, is scheduled for July 11, 2006.
